

March 19th, 2019

The Des Moines County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at the Court House in Burlington at 9 AM on Tuesday, March 19th, 2019, with Chairman Tom Broeker, Vice-Chair Bob Beck and Member Jim Cary present.

Unless otherwise noted, all motions passed unanimously.

The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Meet with Department Heads: County Auditor Terri Johnson gave an update on the April 2nd Burlington School Special Election and stated absentee voting has a low turnout. She attended the ISAC Conference last week and the Auditors discussed the combined City/School Elections. Sheriff Mike Johnstone stated the river level is fluctuating a lot and to stay off the river. Conservation Director Chris Lee stated his crews have started the process of opening the parks. Big Hollow and the 4th Pumping Station should be open by the end of the month. The Skunk River park and access is under water with lots of silt. He predicted a long flooding season. Assistant Land Use Administrator Jarred Lassiter stated their office has received several subdivision inquiries. CDS Director Ken Hyndman attended the ISAC Conference and received lots of good training for his department. Hyndman attended County Days at the Capitol and discussed the MCO's with legislatures. They addressed issues of providers not being paid by the MCO's. County Treasurer Janelle Nalley-Londquist stated the 2nd half of the property taxes are due this month, but property owners have until April 1st to pay without penalty. IT Director Colin Gerst reported his office was busy. County Attorney Lisa Schaefer stated tomorrow is jury trial number six in less than three weeks. There is a new death investigation open and two pending homicides. Schaefer stated the office is short staffed and down a couple of attorneys and they are really busy. County Engineer Brian Carter stated a pre-construction meeting is being held at his office this morning for the Sperry Road Bridge project. Actual construction will not start until summer, but several trees need to be removed before the April 1st deadline for the Indiana Bat migration. Carter stated the gravel roads are drier, but people's patience is wearing out. It will take time to fix all the roads and crews are doing what they can. Supervisor Broeker asked for an update on the Flint Creek Bridge. Carter stated the St Louis Corp office had responded preliminary regarding the Flint Creek Bridge project. He has been playing phone tag with the Rock Island Corps office. They are making headway slowly. Supervisor Cary asked about the quality of gravel. Carter stated you cannot tell the quality of rock by color. He stated all rock quarries must abide by Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) standards or they would not be in business. Maintenance Supervisor Rodney Bliesener reported Johnson Controls is working thru the final stages and layout for the jail control board with minor software issues. Public Health Administrator Christa Poggemiller reported the clinics and school immunizations are keeping them busy. She reported Conservation Director Chris Lee requested a letter of support from the Board of Health for funding of natural resources outdoor recreation trust fund. The Board of Health feels this aligns with the community health needs for outdoor recreation. Safety Director Angie Vaughan was present. Recorder First Deputy Natalie Steffener reported UTV permits have reached 144. County Engineer Carter stated in the northern part of the county they are having problems with UTV's tearing up a dirt road. A land owner brought it to his attention. The new policy does not allow this, and he will make sure law enforcement follows up.

Accounts Payable Claims in the amount of \$569,117.25 was presented. Cary motioned to approve and seconded by Beck.

Resolution 2019-016 Approving the Des Moines County Courthouse and Public Buildings Security Plan, Revision 3.0 was presented. Maintenance Supervisor Rodney Bliesener addressed the revision of the plan. Cary motioned to approve and seconded by Beck.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING DES MOINES COUNTY COURTHOUSE

WHEREAS, Des Moines County, Iowa created a committee to establish a security and safety plan for the Des Moines County Courthouse and County public buildings, and

WHEREAS, said committee developed a Des Moines County Courthouse and Public Buildings Security Plan and

adopted on the 19th day of July 2016, and

WHEREAS, such Plan is critical to ensure a safe working environment for County and State employees, and for the safety of citizens who go to the Courthouse and/or other County public buildings, and

WHEREAS, the Plan includes actions to be taken in the case of natural disasters and for emergency procedures and the safe evacuation of the Courthouse and public buildings in case of threats of injury or violence, as well as to designate the roles and responsibilities of various individuals to assure that these policies are carried out.

WHEREAS, the Plan has been reviewed and updated by the Courthouse and Public Buildings Security Committee and recommends changes per Revision 3.0.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Des Moines County Courthouse and Public Buildings Security Plan, Revision 3.0, is hereby adopted and approved on this day by the Des Moines County Board of Supervisors.

Resolution 2019-017 Opposing Senate Study Bill 1045 and Senate File 184 was presented and addressed by County Engineer Brian Carter. He stated there are lots of issues with this bill and file and credited Lee County for the resolution language. Beck motioned to approve and seconded by Cary.

RESOLUTION OPPOSING SENATE STUDY BILL 1045 AND SENATE FILE 184 PASSED BY THE SENATE
COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION
Resolution 2019-017

WHEREAS, the Transportation Committee in the Iowa Senate has passed House Study Bill 1045 (SF 184) which would amend and make changes to Iowa Code Chapter 321 related to transportation of indivisible loads and raw forestry products on primary and non-primary highways, and;

WHEREAS, Des Moines County owns and maintains nonprimary highways, and is fiscally and legally responsible for the nonprimary highways within the County, and;

WHEREAS, Des Moines County owns and maintains 106 structures classified as bridges by the National Bridge Inspection Standards, and a portion of those are structurally deficient or functionally obsolete, and;

WHEREAS, current funding is not adequate to replace or rehabilitate these bridges at the rate their conditions are deteriorating, and;

WHEREAS, the nonprimary roads and bridges owned by Des Moines County serve a critical need for residents, agricultural users, businesses, schools, post offices, and emergency responders, and;

WHEREAS, the proposed bill would allow the Iowa Department of Transportation to issue annual permits to forestry industry haulers for loads up to 130,000 pounds on nonprimary highways throughout Iowa, without knowledge of or notice given to the agencies which own these highways and the structures thereon, and;

WHEREAS, bridges within Des Moines County have been designed for loads that were legal on Iowa roads at the time of their construction, and bridges have only been rated or posted with weight restrictions for loads that are currently legal on roads, and each bridge within Des Moines County is unique based on its age, design, and current

condition, and load rating to ensure safe passage of loads greater than 80,000 pounds would be unique for each load on each individual bridge, and;

WHEREAS, the traversing of Des Moines County bridges by loads up to 130,000 pounds without the County being afforded the knowledge of or the ability to restrict each occurrence, would result in gradual and possibly sudden failure of bridges within the County, and;

WHEREAS, Des Moines County would likely bear legal and financial liability for subsequent failure of its bridges, even if such failures are caused by loads they did not permit, and Des Moines County is not financially able to repair or replace bridges which would be subject to accelerated deterioration by increased loads, and;

WHEREAS, Des Moines County and its residents, farmers, businesses, schools, post offices, and emergency responders, would be subjected to undue operational and economic hardships by further degradation of its road system and the structures thereon;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Des Moines County Board of Supervisors strongly urges all Iowa lawmakers to vote in opposition to this legislation.

Future Agenda Items: April 2nd – Secondary Roads Construction Program Tour and April 9th – Secondary Roads Construction Program Presentation. Personnel Evaluations for the Engineer and CPC Director.

Committee reports. All Board members attended the Iowa State Association of Counties (ISAC) Conference last week. Cary attended a RUSS meeting and a new secretary, Kelly Martin has been hired.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:42 AM.

Work sessions following the meeting:

The Board of Supervisors and County Engineer Brian Carter discussed driveway entrances. Currently a permit and \$35 fee are charged for new entrances. The county provides maintenance thereafter and any work to entrances is a last priority. Carter stated some counties have gotten out of the driveway entrance business and some counties charge actual costs for installing entrances. Supervisor Beck wants to review a template document for a change in the driveway entrance policy.

The Board of Supervisors and County Engineer Brian Carter discussed the 60th Street project request. Several months ago, Randy Winegard had talked to the Board regarding the extension of the concrete portion of 60th Street to his subdivision. Carter provided a cost estimate. Additional right-of-way would be required, culverts would need to be replaced and a curb and gutter paved road installed. Estimated total cost would be approximately \$656,642. This is just an estimate and discussion. The Board would have to make the decision whether to proceed with the project and the cost sharing of the project.

The Board of Supervisors and County Engineer took a road tour.
