**AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE #62**

WHEREAS the Des Moines County Board of Supervisors adopted Regulations for the Siting and Operation of Wind Energy Conversion Systems (Ordinance No. 62) on July 18, 2023, and

WHEREAS in order to ensure consistency between Ordinance No. 62 and the proposed Ordinance No. 63 (Regulations for the Siting and Operation of Solar Farm Energy Systems), it is necessary to amend several specific passages in Ordinance No. 62.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Board of Supervisors hereby amends Ordinance No. 62, by altering Article II to change the definitions for the following terms:

**BATTERY ENERGY STORAGE SYSTEM (BESS).** *An electrochemical device that enables the energy from a Commercial Wind Energy Conversion System to be stored on site, and be readily available during times of especially high demand or during emergencies.*

**DEVELOPER.** *The person(s) and/or entit(ies) pursuing the development of a Wind Energy Conversion System, who are responsible for submitting a Siting Permit application and all required attachments necessary for the review and approval thereof by the County.*

**OPERATOR.** *The person(s) or entit(ies) responsible for the day-to-day operation and maintenance of a Wind Energy Conversion System, including any third-party subcontractors. This term shall apply to all subsequent operators of the System, if such responsibility is transferred at any point during its operational lifespan.*

**OWNER, WIND ENERGY CONVERSION SYSTEM.** *The person(s) and/or entit(ies) that own the structures and equipment comprising a Wind Energy Conversion System, regardless of whether or not they also own the land upon which it is situated. This term shall apply to all subsequent owners of the System, if ownership is transferred at any point during its operational lifespan.*

**PARTICIPATING PROPERTY.** *Any property on which a portion of a Commercial Wind Energy Conversion System is physically located. In any instance where a property under common ownership is split into multiple adjacent parcels for taxation purposes (using section, quarter-section, and quarter-quarter lines from the Public Land Survey System), the entire property shall be considered a 'participating property', regardless of whether or not each individual tax parcel physically contains a portion of the CWECS.*

**COMMERCIAL WIND ENERGY CONVERSION SYSTEM (CWECS).** *A utility-scale WECS where the energy produced is intended to be distributed to the electrical power grid for use by the public at-large, either within Des Moines County or elsewhere. Little, if any of the energy produced will be consumed on the subject property and/or adjoining properties. This typically involves over one hundred (100) acres of private agricultural land, where one or more landowners lease the land to a wind energy company which owns and maintains the wind energy equipment.*

**PERSONAL WIND ENERGY CONVERSION SYSTEM (PWECS).** *A WECS where the energy produced is primarily intended for consumption on the subject property and/or one or more adjoining properties. Excess energy generated by the WECS may be sold and distributed to*

*an electrical utility provider serving the general public, but as designed, the majority of the energy generated will be consumed on site. This typically involves an individual wind turbine that is owned and maintained by the landowner.*

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED: That the Board of Supervisors hereby amends Ordinance No. 62, by altering the following specified sections of the ordinance, to read as follows:

Article I, Section D(1): *The regulations contained within this ordinance shall apply only to Commercial Wind Energy Conversion Systems, as herein defined, along with any structures and equipment directly associated with an SFES, such as Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) and Meteorological Evaluation Towers. No permits, public hearings, or other official action by the County shall be required for Personal Wind Energy Conversion Systems, as herein defined, or any directly associated structures and equipment.*

Article VI, Section C, first sentence: **Decommissioning Plan – Submission Requirements.** *Prior to the approval of any Siting Permit for a SFES, the developer shall submit a Decommissioning Plan to the Administrator, which complies with all requirements listed in Section B of this Article, and includes each of the following:*

Article VI, Section C(4), first sentence: *Documentation of existing conditions prior to the establishment of the CWECS, for the County to use as a baseline reference in determining whether the land has been restored to its pre-development condition during decommissioning.*

Article VI, Section G, first sentence: **Determination of Abandonment.** *Any CWECS, or portion thereof, that has not been in operation for a period of three hundred sixty-five (365) consecutive days shall be deemed to be abandoned by the Administrator, and notification of this determination shall be submitted to the owner and/or operator at this time.*

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED: That the Board of Supervisors hereby amends Ordinance No. 62, by adding the following specified sections of the ordinance, to read as follows:

Article IV, Section B(11), sub-section 'a': *Prior to its submittal to the Board, the Emergency Response Plan shall be reviewed and approved by Des Moines County Emergency Management and the applicable Fire Department(s) serving the CWECS project area.*

Article IV, Section F(3), sub-section 'a': *If any specific portion of a participating property is not covered by the lease or easement agreement with the CWECS operator, then that portion shall be removed from the total size of the CWECS, when calculating the fee.*

Article VI, Section C(4), sub-section 'b': *Specific measurements shall be provided for the Corn Suitability Rating (CSR) and the extent of soil compaction.*

## **Fifth Amendment to the Systems of Care Mental Health Wrap-around Contract**

This Amendment to Contract Number DCAT4-22-024 is effective as of December 1, 2023, between the Iowa Department of Health and Human Services (Agency) and Des Moines County (Contractor).

### **Section 1: Amendment to Contract Language**

The Contract is amended as follows:

#### **Revision 1. Section 1.2 Contract Purpose, is hereby amended as follows:**

The parties have entered into this Contract for the purpose of retaining the Contractor to provide Systems of Care services to families with minor children in Appanoose, Davis, Des Moines, Henry, Jefferson, Keokuk, Lee, Louisa, Mahaska, Monroe, Van Buren, Wapello, and Washington Counties not served through existing programs and funding sources.

#### **Revision 2. Section 1.3.1 Deliverables, Deliverable 1.3.1.(A), is hereby amended as follows:**

Contractor will ensure services will be provided through a Systems of Care model, to families with children ages 3 through 17 years old, living in Appanoose, Davis, Des Moines, Henry, Jefferson, Keokuk, Lee, Louisa, Mahaska, Monroe, Van Buren, Wapello, and Washington Counties.

#### **Revision 3. Section 1.3.1 Deliverables, Deliverable 1.3.1.(B), is hereby amended as follows:**

Contractor will develop and implement a referral process for organizations serving families and children in Appanoose, Davis, Des Moines, Henry, Jefferson, Keokuk, Lee, Louisa, Mahaska, Monroe, Van Buren, Wapello, and Washington Counties. Referrals to this program may be received from a variety of helping service professionals including: health care, mental health care, educators, Iowa Department of Health and Human Services, Juvenile Court Services, family support programs, and law enforcement.

#### **Revision 4. 1.3.4.2 Payment Methodology, is hereby amended as follows:**

In accordance with the payment terms outlined in this section and the Contractor's completion of the Scope of Work as set forth in this Contract, the Contractor will be compensated \$15,000.00, as follows:

The Contractor will be reimbursed at the following rates for direct services:

- \$25.84 per unit for case management services
- \$26.39 per unit for Individual Behavioral Intervention Services
- \$25.84 per unit for Behavioral Intervention Services with family
- \$25.84 per unit for meeting participation (Individual Education Plans, Probation, Court)
- \$149.71 Initial Evaluation
- \$118.97 60-minute individual therapy
- \$108.16 45-minute individual therapy
- \$70.59 30-minute individual therapy
- \$53.30 Additional 30-minute individual therapy
- \$112.53 Family therapy
- \$62.77 Group therapy

\$138.33 60-minute crisis services  
 \$53.30 Each additional 30 minutes of crisis services

Expenses for direct services related to therapeutic recreation activities, which are submitted with appropriate documentation, will be reimbursed at actual cost.

The Contractor will be reimbursed for expenses with documentation showing expense and payment. Those would include: Systems of Care services in Section 1.3.1(A), outreach materials and supplies, mileage with submission of mileage sheet, staff training and travel cost associated with training.

There are no indirect fees for the Contractor.

Claims are due the 20th of the month after the end of month of service.

Payment aligns with contract performance expectations and other terms and conditions of this contract. Payment shall be withheld, in the event that required quarterly program performance reports or planning, and implementation reports are delinquent or proper documentation is not provided, until such time as the delinquency is corrected.

**Section 2: Ratification & Authorization**

Except as expressly amended and supplemented herein, the Contract shall remain in full force and effect, and the parties hereby ratify and confirm the terms and conditions thereof. Each party to this Amendment represents and warrants to the other that it has the right, power, and authority to enter into and perform its obligations under this Amendment, and it has taken all requisite actions (corporate, statutory, or otherwise) to approve execution, delivery and performance of this Amendment, and that this Amendment constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation.

**Section 3: Execution**

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF**, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth above and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt, adequacy and legal sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties have entered into the above Amendment and have caused their duly authorized representatives to execute this Amendment.

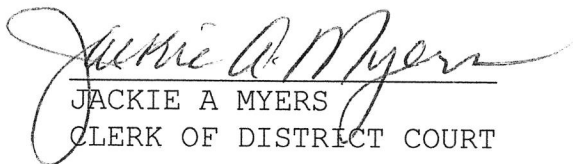

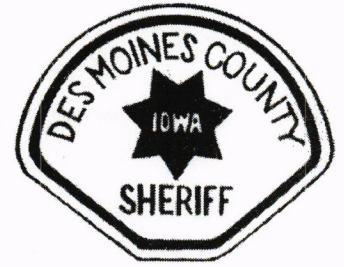

The Des Moines County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at the Court House in Burlington at 8:30 AM on Wednesday, November 8, 2023, with Chair Shane McCampbell, Vice-Chair Tom Broeker and Member Jim Cary present. This meeting was also held electronically via Webex and YouTube live streaming. Public input was available through board email or call in.

Unless otherwise noted, all motions passed unanimously. The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Meeting with Department Heads: Maintenance Director Rodney Bliesener gave an update on the Tiger Grant projects. Public Health Director Christa Poggemiller stated the FDA put out a notice that certain baby foods have had a recall due to high lead levels for children. County Treasurer Janelle Nalley-Londquist reported her office sent delinquent property tax notices last week. County Recorder Natalie Steffener stated her office remains busy. Conservation Director Chris Lee stated his department is in the process of getting the parks prepared for winter. IT Director Colin Gerst reported his office is busy. Sheriff Kevin Glendening reported the jail population at 92. County Auditor Sara Doty stated the City/School Election held yesterday went well. She is working on getting the documents prepared to have the 1<sup>st</sup> Tier Canvass next Tuesday the 14<sup>th</sup>. She reminds the Department Heads of the Holiday Friday, stating she will need any agenda items tomorrow. County Engineer Brian Carter reported his crews are working on shouldering County roads. His department stays busy behind the scenes, preparing for upcoming projects.

No correspondence was received.

Approval of Accounts Payable Claims in the amount of \$1,070,109.98 were presented. Cary made a motion to approve and was seconded by Broeker.

2<sup>nd</sup> Public Hearing to amend Wind Ordinance #62 was held. Broeker made a motion to open the Public Hearing and Cary seconded. McCampbell asked Auditor Doty if any public comments had been received. None received. There were no public comments. Broeker made a motion to close the Public Hearing and seconded by Cary. Broeker made a motion to approve the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading of the amended Wind Ordinance #62 seconded by Cary.

2<sup>nd</sup> Public Hearing to Adopt Solar Ordinance #63 was held. Cary made a motion to open the Public Hearing and Broeker seconded. Assistant Land Use Administrator Jarred Lassiter spoke on the Ordinance. McCampbell asked Auditor Doty if any public comments had been received. None received. Justin Foss with Alliant Energy gave comment regarding the Ordinance over WebEx. He stated the Ordinance looked great and allowed a path moving forward for protection. He gave a piece of input on a change for the set back from roads. He will forward that information to the Board of Supervisors and SEIRPC for consideration. Broeker made a motion to close the Public Hearing and seconded by Cary. Broeker made a motion to approve the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading of Solar Ordinance #63 and seconded by Cary.

Approval of a Memorandum of Understanding with the CWA was presented. Broeker made a motion to approve and was seconded by Cary.
