

RESOLUTION #2024-025 REGARDING DISBURSEMENT OF OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDS FOR PURCHASE OF HANDHELD NARCOTICS ANALYZERS

- a.) **WHEREAS**, Des Moines County is a party to the National Opioid Settlement Agreement, and
- b.) **WHEREAS,** Des Moines County has received settlement funds as a result of the National Opioid Settlement Agreement, and
- c.) **WHEREAS**, as a requirement of the National Opioid Settlement Agreement, said funds are to be used in the remediation of the opioid epidemic within Des Moines County, including narcotics enforcement by law enforcement agencies; and
- d.) **WHEREAS**, it is recommended that Des Moines County use a portion of the settlement funds to purchase two (2) handheld narcotics analyzers for use by the Des Moines County Sheriff's Department and the Burlington Police Department; and
- e.) **WHEREAS**, the handheld narcotics analyzers will increase the safety of law enforcement officers by alleviating the need for direct handling of unknown substances by law enforcement personnel to assist in determining if those substances are, in fact, illegal contraband; and
- f.) **WHEREAS**, the purchase price of the handheld narcotics analyzers is \$40,300 each for a total of \$80,600;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED; that the purchase of two (2) handheld narcotics analyzers will assist law enforcement in narcotics enforcement and is directly related to the remediation of the opioid use disorder in Des Moines County as required by the National Opioid Settlement Agreement.

The Des Moines County Board of Supervisors met in special session at the Court House in Burlington at 9:00 AM on Tuesday, April 9, 2024, with Chair Tom Broeker, Vice-Chair Jim Cary, and Member Shane McCampbell present. This meeting was also held electronically via Webex and YouTube live streaming. Public input was available through board email or call in.

The pledge of allegiance was conducted.

A public hearing was held on the proposed property tax levy. McCampbell motioned to open the public hearing and was seconded by Cary. Broeker explained the new HF718 legislation. Jim Holtkamp, Tama Twp., and Greg Mangold, 2216 Senica Dr., both asked the Board of Supervisors questions regarding the letter they received and for clarification on the assessment value and the County budget process. Chairman Broeker asked Auditor Doty if she received any public comment in the Auditor's Office. None received. Cary made a motion to close the public hearing and McCampbell seconded.

Item 5D was removed from the agenda. Unless otherwise noted, all motions passed unanimously. The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Meeting with Department Heads: County Auditor Sara Doty wanted to remind the public that Rural Spring Cleanup began on April 8th and will run until June 8th, or the funds are depleted. IT Director Colin Gerst reported his office is busy. Sheriff Kevin Glendening reported the "Bob's Best Shot Memorial Ride" took place this past Saturday and raised roughly \$12,000 for our local K9 units. The active shooter training that was held at the Courthouse this past Friday went well. The jail population is 92. Assessor Matt Warner stated the 2024 assessment notices were sent out last week. The month of April is the time frame to appeal your value at the Assessor's Office. The Board of Review petitions are taken until April 30th. Local Health Director Christa Poggemiller reported her office is busy. Budget Director Cheryl McVey stated we have received several letters from the HF718 mailing as returned in the Auditor's Office. If you did not receive a letter, you can give the Auditor's Office a call and see if we have it in the office. MHASEI CDS Director Ken Hyndman gave us a Mental Health update. County Recorder Natalie Steffener reported her office is busy. Emergency Management Director Shannon Prado reported there are new emergency response guidebooks from the State, and you can access them online if needed. She also added that the Active Shooter training held on Friday was a success. County Attorney Lisa Schaefer reported her office is busy. County Engineer Brian Carter stated the weather is getting warmer and his crews are getting busier. Golf Course Rd closed yesterday, and the contractors are on site working today. Spring Lake and Sullivan Slough Railroad crossings were looking at getting closed by the railroad on the 18th & 19th of April, but with those being an only access point for some residents, they went back to the drawing board. They are potentially looking at putting a gravel jog around the crossing for traffic, while they repair the crossing. The Engineer's Office will update the public, as they are notified. Maintenance Director Rodney Bliesener stated the active shooter drill went well and wanted to give his thanks to all involved in making it happen.
